She will join HLIP co-chairs [Dr. Victor Dzau](#), [Dr. Jane Halton](#), [Dr. Jean Kaseya](#), [Dr. John-Arne Rottingen](#), and [Dr. Benedict Oramah](#), along with experts from around the world, to discuss next steps and interim recommendations.

The HLIP will release new recommendations this fall, which will be focused on solutions for financing to expand access to medical countermeasures during public health emergencies and financing to accelerate pandemic preparedness.

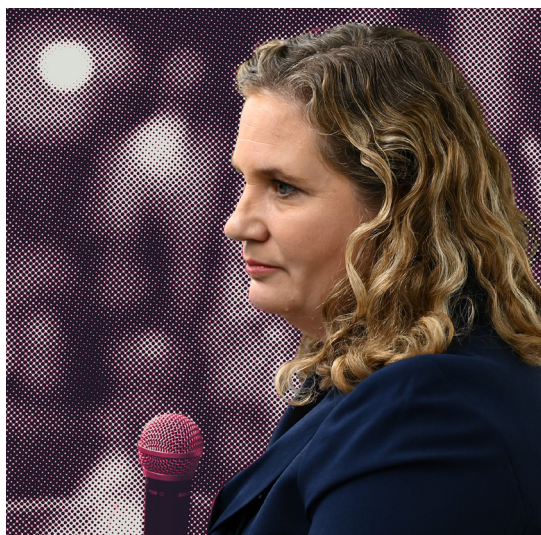
Healthy Indoor Air: A Global Call to Action
